SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION BULLETIN

July 23, 2007

The Town of Madison Police Department is releasing the following information pursuant to Wisconsin State Statute 301.46(2m) which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public of a sex offender's release when; in the discretion of the agency, the release of information will enhance public safety, awareness and protection. The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of sex offenses. Further, his criminal history places him in a classification level, which reflects the potential to re-offend.

This offender has served the incarceration sentence imposed on him by the courts. **He is NOT wanted by the police at this time.** *This notification is not intended to increase fear, rather, it is our belief that an informed public is a safer public.*

Sex offenders **have always** lived in our communities; but it was not until Act 440 was enacted that law enforcement is able to share this information with the community. **Citizen abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate or harass registered sex offenders will NOT be tolerated.**

Martin Chavez has been released on parole for convictions in 1999 and 2000 for second-degree sexual assault of a child. The incidents involved teenage girls.

Martin Chavez will be residing in the Town of Madison at 2251 Badger Lane #9. **Chavez** needs to comply with all supervision rules and is a lifetime registrant of the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registration Program.

Additional Sex Offender Information:

As of the date of this bulletin, there are over 19,000 sex offenders who have registered as required in the State of Wisconsin. There are over 5,000 sex offenders on probation or parole throughout the State. Approximately 680 of these are registered to Dane County Addresses.
